Within Vanderhoof Annerose has coordinated artistic endeavours including the street banner project. Her paintings are inspired by satellite images of the BC forests and explore both the value of the logging industry and the destruction of the cutblocks.

Leanna Carlson is the President of the Community Arts Council and the Secretary of the Central Interior Regional Arts Council. Among her many responsibilities Leanna is also a potter, creating unique works that blend their functional aspects with artistic design. Each work is thrown and fired at her home in Prince George and often resembles her surrounding environment, taking on the form, nature and colour of the forest and fields that surround her home. Leanna resides is also an active member of the PG Potters Guild.

Two Rivers Gallery News

Current Exhibitions

August 6th to October 17th the Two Rivers Gallery will be exhibiting Gerald Hushlak: Bred and Reva Stone: Future Self.

Gerald Hushlak, a professor in the Fine Arts Faculty at the University of Calgary, conflates art and cutting edge technology to produce artwork that is as remarkable to look at as it is provocative. In 1974, Hushlak won the Word Print Competition hosted jointly by the Smithsonian Institute and the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art for a computer generated print. Since then he has maintained a diverse practice incorporating painting, sculpture, installation work and a deep and abiding interest in a range of computer-assisted techniques. This exhibition focuses on a series of digital prints that stem from a process he has developed wherein two images are virtually bred together. Using a computer based algorithm, successive generations of offspring are produced and bred again. At different stages in their evolution, images are sampled and produced as digital prints. Subjects range from images of bicycles and cearcuts to the Venice Biennale.

Winnipeg based artist, Reva Stone, investigates the mediation between our bodies and emerging technologies that are altering how we interact with the world. The boundary between what is born and what is manufactured in increasingly blurred. In her work, she explores questions around the nature and limits of being human and the nature and limits of intelligent machines. The exhibition incorporates both a multi-media installation and digital prints, drawing from two bodies of work in order

to investigate the underlying social, technological and cultural narratives that are being played out around these issues.

The Opening night will be on Thursday, August 5th. The artists' talk with both Gerald Hushlak and Reva Stone will be at 7:30 pm with the after party at 8:30 pm. Hors D'oeuvres provided by Dish.
