
From the Executive Director

IMSS Call for Proposals

The Immigrant & Multicultural Services Society is putting out a call for permanent public artwork proposals by Visual Artists with the theme of 'Celebrating Diversity'. Proposals may be for both 2D or 3D media and will be located at the Prince George Airport or the Prince George Public Library. The proposals must be in by midnight on January 16th by electronic or land mail with the selection being made by January 23rd. The project must be completed by May 26, 2012.

Prince George, as a city, is evolving economically and physically but also demographically as more highly skilled new immigrants choose Prince George as their new Canadian home. Successful new immigrants with skills from medicine to customer service talk about Prince George as a safe and embracing community with the amenities of a big city without the stress, expense and chaos that can come with big city life. When asked "why stay in Prince George..." these new Canadians unanimously answer "because of the people". Prince George's foundation is reflected in its people who embrace work, play and family life with a sense of belonging and pride of place.

The new public artwork celebrating diversity will act as a talisman for welcoming newcomers and visitors. It will also be a reminder, to the people who have been here all their lives, that Prince George is a diverse community with a welcoming and inclusive heart.

Prince George is located in the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh First Nations and they refer to this land as a gathering place where the two rivers flow together.

Fort St. John Hospital Call for Proposals

The Fort St. John Community Arts Council requests artists for proposals for an indoor ceremonial commencement art project for the newly constructed Fort St. John Hospital

located in Fort St. John, BC. The application deadline for expression of interest is January 18th and the application for the final project is due on February 15, 2012

In the fall of 2012, both provincial and local dignitaries will officially open the new Fort St. John Hospital and Residential Care Facility, the first newly constructed hospital facility to be built in Northern British Columbia in the past 40 years. The Peace River Regional Hospital District is proud to be a funding partner in this public-private partnership project along with the Province of BC and Northern Health. The project includes a 55-bed acute and ambulatory care hospital and a 123-bed residential care facility located at 8407 - 112th Avenue in Fort St. John, BC. The Peace River Regional Hospital District has contributed \$98 million dollars toward the capital construction costs of the project.

To celebrate the opening of the new Hospital, the Peace River Regional Hospital District through the Fort St. John Community Arts Council is seeking proposals from artists to create an art installation that will become the Peace River Regional Hospital District commemorative dedication piece at the official opening of the Hospital facility. The work will focus on using the main staircase space to include the air space and wall space located in the stairwell leading up from the main lobby to the second floor. This is a special opportunity for artists to design and create a permanent artistic installation utilizing the staircase to promote health and wellness to invite participation of patients and visitors to take the stairs in a visually stimulating environment.

Proposals should incorporate the use of the existing wall space surrounding the stairwell (one flight of stairs including a midpoint landing), and the natural light from a bank of west facing windows (see illustration). Individual artists and groups are encouraged to apply. Priority will be given to proposals that provide an innovative use of materials and structures.

The artwork, in the stairwell, should relate to the concept of bringing natural elements indoors to create a gentle, healing and welcoming atmosphere and to promote the northern way of caring for health and wellness through active participation by using the stairs. The ideal installation will retain the character of the building and will be a wall and/or ceiling installation that will not be mounted on the floor. The permanent artwork, designed for longevity, must be sustainable and may include:

- Natural light by day and self-generated (solar) illumina-

tion by night;

- Natural colours
- Heritage images with a story line
- Any environmentally friendly medium and materials including recycled
- Innovative new technology

The materials used should be appropriate to the indoor and sterile hospital environment and should meet health and safety standards. The artwork must comply with all appropriate Building Codes associated with design, development, construction, implementation and operation of the facility.

Music Appreciation Course

Join Gordon Lucas, well known composer and conductor of the Northern Orchestra on Wednesday evenings from January 11 to March 8 for an 11 week survey of Western Music at CNC Nechako. If anybody in Prince George is interested in the course but don’t want to drive to Vanderhoof he is offering to teach it in Prince George on his own time at a mutually agreed upon time and place if you sign up for the course. Registration must be done by January 4, 2012.

Explore Western Music from Ancient Greek through the Medieval and Renaissance periods, concentrating on the Baroque to Modern Eras. The course will include a handbook, recorded examples and live performances in the classroom, demonstrating the development of music from the standpoint of the famous composers, the importance they had to their times and contemporary events and developments that shaped their aesthetics.

Gordon taught the same course at Capilano College in Vancouver and through extended education in Langley. It is worthwhile, and will give you the knowledge and vocabulary necessary to grasp even University course content at the 1st year level. It comes highly recommended - it’s a course you will enjoy, and Gordon is very comfortable teaching it.

Gordon has arranged with the College to have the price lowered to \$275, and you may bring (as a matter of fact he encourages it) a friend, or a family member (or even two) to share in the knowledge and music being presented. That makes it an ideal Christmas gift, too!

“I’m doing this because I am very much interested in a grassroots cultural reincarnation. It’s kind of like my life’s mission right now. I would especially recommend this course to any student, my own or otherwise, who is even contemplating a further study of music after high school graduation. This course will definitely give you background you do not have at present.” Says Gordon.
