## Two Rivers Gallery News

### Current Exhibitions

The Two Rivers Gallery will be featuring Karilee Fuglem as well as their Permanent Collection. The exhibits will be on display from October 29th to January 9th with the Opening Night on the 28th.

Prince George born Karilee Fuglem, now of Montreal, has enjoyed a notable career as an artist, having participated in exhibitions at the Oakville Galleries, the National Gallery of Canada, the Musee National des Beaux-Arts du Quebec, the Southern Alberta Art Gallery, Montreal Museum of Contemporary Art and numerous other art centres. Her oeuvre, subtle and poetic, demonstrates her interest in exploring those things located at the threshold of perception.

As we navigate the course of our bodily journeys we are subject to a range of influences, sometimes intangible and sometimes barely perceivable or even invisible. Though we usually can't glimpse our connections to people, places or a particular time, for instance, they can be felt as strongly as the substance of an important conversation. Karilee Fuglem works to give shape to this matrix of complex interconnections and experiences, often using material that is as ethereal as the concepts she

explores. She has produced installations out of monofilament that flit in and out of view according to changes in the ambient light and has filled galleries with clouds. This exhibition, her first in B.C., will survey previous work, setting a context for a new project that explores aspects of her birthplace.

Though still small, the Two River Gallery collection continues to grow into an eclectic body of paintings, prints, drawings, sculpture and other media. It reflects the experience of life and living in north and western Canada through work drawn from exhibitions, collectors and artists. This exhibition will focus around a series of recently acquired drawings and works on paper featuring artists like B.C. Binning, Peter von Tiesenhansen and Pnina Granirer.

The Opening night will be on Thursday, October 28th. The artists' talk with Karilee Fuglem will be at 7:30 pm with the after party at 8:30 pm. Hors D'oeuvres provided by Dish.

## The Groop Gallery Current Exhibit

Excursions/work in Canada's High Arctic (1988, 1991), to the Antarctic Peninsula (1999), and to Nunavut and Greenland (2006) have changed my life. My earlier polar artworks have been exhibited in solo exhibits in Quesnel, Smithers, Vancouver and Wells, B.C. as well as in Antofagasta, Chile. Selected works from "Polar Perspectives" will be exhibited at the Groop Gallery in Prince George, B.C. commencing October 15, 2010. Please see Studio notes for details.

Following a 2006 polar journey I began developing the series,

"Polar Perspectives". The works are created using acrylic and oil paints to convey impressionistic images of Arctic shifting light and form. Often superimposed on the canvas is a kayak: an indicator of the change inherent in Inuit life. Images swirl of light and life-filled landscape, of animal and human populations in the face of ongoing challenges.

## Two Rivers Call for Entry - Us

As a collection of individuals we make up our families, our neighbourhoods, communities, towns and state, sometimes blending in easily to those around us, sometimes sticking out because of our differences. Homogenous or disparate, what makes us who we are? Us is an important notion that we use to define ourselves. A slippery slope, however, when there is an US there is also a THEM and this can lead to discrimination and conflict. "Us" presumes a sense of community, shared values or perhaps a similar vision of the future. But how does the notion of the self relate to the idea of us and why do we sometimes talk about saving us from ourselves? Two Rivers Gallery is interested in exploring the notion of "US" in a group exhibition that will run from 14 April to 3 July, 2011. The gallery encourages artists from across BC working in any media to share in an examination of this notion from any perspective by submitting images and details of up to six artworks from which this exhibition will be chosen.

### **Guidelines:**

- Visual artists can submit images for up to six completed works. Please include a statement that addresses each work individually or as part of a group.
- Work must have been produced within the last three years and should not have been previously exhibited in Prince George.
- The Gallery will pay fees to artists selected for exhibition and assist with shipping.

### **What to Send:**

A package clearly marked "US Exhibition" containing the follow-

ing:

- Slides, or good quality photographs, labelled with artist's name, title of work and dimensions.
- An image list including titles, date of production, medium and size.
- A brief statement about the work.
- A current resumé, curriculum vitae or short statement about yourself.
- A self-addressed envelope stamped with sufficient return postage. Stamps only please.
- A completed and signed entry form (found on the reverse of this document).

Packages that do not include the above may be deemed incomplete and disqualified.

### **Deadlines:**

All submissions should be received by Two Rivers Gallery no later than 4pm, on 5 December, 2010. Original art will not be accepted at this point, please send clearly labelled slides or good quality photographs. Exhibition date is 14 April to 3 July, 2011. Subject to change.

## Termination of Francophone Employment Services

October 20, 2010 - The Francophones in Prince George and Northern British Columbia are being targeted by the cuts announced by the Ministry of Housing and Social Development on October 1st, 2010. The employment services offered by the College Éducentre, Prince George's campus, will be cancelled at the end of January, even before the end of the contract. Moreover, the reasons given by the Ministry do not match the current service level.

"There is no doubt this decision is detrimental to the Prince George community," says Robert Doyon, president of Le Cercle des Canadiens Français and he adds, "The employment services level offered at the Educentre campus in Prince George is at a premium and the number of times people come for help amounts to an average of 100 per month. The people who visit the employment service center discover other existing programs on site in the educational and cultural sectors. This structure facilitates the integration of several newcomers in their new community. "

"I am appalled by the lack of provincial commitment to official languages of Canada. Francophones who live or wish to settle in Prince George should not have to seek employment services at centers that will not respond to their needs." says Renée Trépanier, the Francophone association's Executive Director.

Just a few months ago, Le Cercle des Canadiens Français was informed that the BC Gaming grant, which have been useful for social and cultural activities offered to all age groups, will be reduced by half starting in January 2011.

Le Cercle des Canadiens Français offers several programs and services to the people of Prince George and its surrounding area since 1960. The Prince George's campus of the Éducentre College was opened at the French Community Centre in 2000 to provide employment services and since then have expanded to more educational services. There are about 4, 585 people who use French at home or at work in Prince George. Over 250 of them state using French at work.

## CCA Releases Five Year Strategic Plan

Toronto, October 20, 2010 – The Canada Council for the Arts outlined today its priorities for the next five years with the release of Strengthening Connections: Strategic Plan 2011-16.

"This plan continues the vision and strategic directions of the Council's 2008-11 Plan while expanding its focus to better reflect changes in the broader environment," noted Robert Sirman, Director and CEO. "The plan responds to what we heard during a broad consultation process and highlights how we bring value to our constituents and stakeholders."

The Plan will continue with the five directions of its current strategic plan and overlay them with three key themes on technology, public engagement and synergy.

"In a period of constrained growth, the Council will embrace opportunities that new technologies offer for better connectivity, broaden the public conversation on the place of art and culture in our lives, and enrich the quality of the relationships between the Council, the arts community and the Canadian public," added Mr. Sirman.

The five directions are:

working alone or collaboratively, as the core of artistic practice in Canada;

- \* Broaden the Council's commitment to arts organizations to strengthen their capacity to underpin artistic practices in all parts of the country;

- \* Enhance the Council's leadership role in promoting equity as a critical priority in fulfilling Canada's artistic aspirations;

- \* Make partnerships with other organizations a key element in the Council's approach to advancing its mandate; and

- \* Enhance the Council's capacity to support the arts and implement change, by strengthening its structure, staffing and services.

A Corporate Plan Summary, to be released in spring 2011, will provide further details on how the Council will implement its strategic directions over the next five years.
