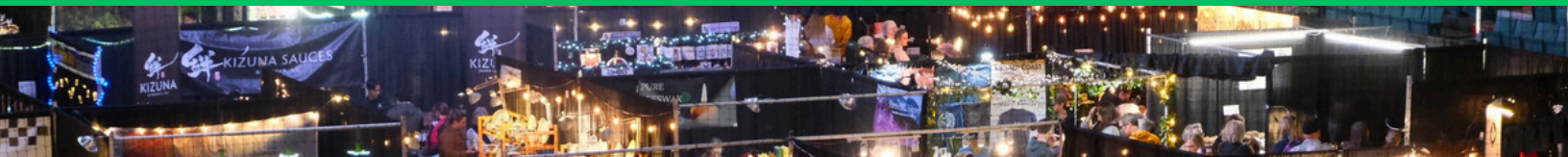

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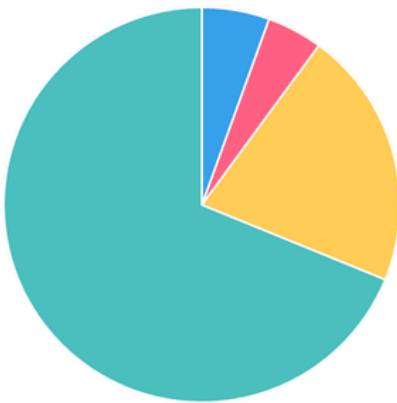
## Message from the President:

## Revenue & Expenses:

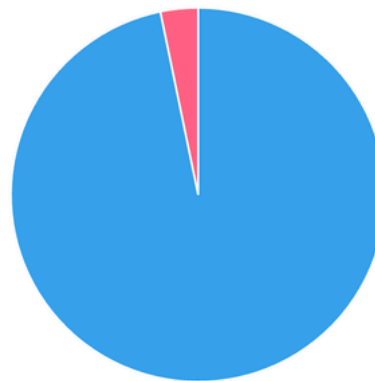
### Revenue
